LIEUTENANT COLONEL TIMOTHY D. KIMBROUGH

Lieutenant Colonel Kimbrough is the Commander and Professor of Aerospace Studies, Detachment 535, Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) at Syracuse University, New York. He is responsible for recruiting, educating, training, motivating, selecting and commissioning officer candidates through the program. Air Force ROTC provides academic instruction on fundamental Air Force doctrine, practical leadership experience, and extensive field training emphasizing officership and physical fitness to prepare future officers for active duty.

Colonel Kimbrough is 1995 graduate of Michigan State University where he earned his commission through Detachment 380, Air Force ROTC. His career in intelligence spans national, theater, and unit-level operations supporting both peacetime and combat operations with theater experience in imagery intelligence operations and target system analysis in the USEUCOM AOR. At the unit-level he has supported Air Force operations across Air Combat Command, Pacific Air Forces, Central Air Forces, and Air Mobility Command participating in both peacetime and contingency operations where he served as a Fighter Squadron Intelligence Flight Commander, Fighter Wing Intelligence Weapons Officer, USAF Weapons School Intelligence Weapons Instructor, Airlift Wing Senior Intelligence Officer, and Chief and Deputy Chief of intelligence analysis and operations Divisions for US European Command and Pacific Air Forces. Most recently, he Commanded the 37th Intelligence Squadron at Hickam Field, Hawaii, where he led over 125 Airmen, Civilians, and Contractors executing offensive and defensive cyberspace operations and directing focused and timely cyberspace ISR and digital network exploitation in support of the Air Force, US Cyber Command, the National Security Agency, and US Pacific Command.



Colonel Kimbrough's first contingency experience was Operations DELIBERATE GUARD/DELIBERATE FORGE and ALLIED FORCE as US European Command Liaison Officer, US National Intelligence Cell, Combined Air Operations Center, Vicenza, Italy. Since then he has supported numerous Operations ENDURING FREEDOM and IRAQI FREEDOM combat missions including F-15E, F-16CJ, F-16CG, airborne ISR, strategic and theater airlift, and refueling activities across multiple Global Combatant Commands. Additionally, he served as Chief of Unit Support, Combined Air Operations Center, al Udeid Air Base, Qatar. His most recent contingency support was at Ramstein Air Base, Germany, as Senior Intelligence Officer for Air Mobility Command Strategic Airlift Operations in Europe.
